Balto came to the Tulsa SPCA in late 2021. After a few weeks, we noticed he was drinking a lot more water than normal. After running tests, including bloodwork and urinalysis, everything came back remarkably clean. Thus, we suspected a syndrome called psychogenetic polydipsia.

This is a psychatric disorder that causes compulsive water drinking. There is no test for this syndrome, simply a trial of



medication called fluoxetine. After a few weeks of this, he improved greatly and was adopted shortly thereafter. He is loving life with his forever family! Such a swift diagnosis, treatment, and adoption would not have been possible without our incredible team.

Freddie Mercury

Freddie came to the Tulsa SPCA in early 2022 after neighbors witnessed a dog attacking him. He was reportedly just a neighborhood cat. The incident left him with a crushed pelvis and multiple fractures to his left hind leg. Due to the nature of the fractures, surgical repair or splinting were not options. Thus, the best course of action was amputation.

The road to Freddie's recovery after the amputation would be

New Clinic Services

Did you know the Tulsa SPCA Low-Cost Clinic has services that go beyond wellness checks, spay/neuter and vaccine clinics? These include dental care, laser therapy, orthopedic surgeries, chiropractic care, acupuncture, and more. Wellness for your pet is comprehensive, just like for humans.

Highway (pictured on the right) was found by a client who picked her up from the side of the road. After X-rays and a consultation, we found her humerus was fractured and would need a pin to repair it. Our clinic team was able to perform the surgery on the same day. After six weeks, the pin was removed and she was adopted!

Unfortunately, while his pelvis and other leg were healing well, his muscle and skin began to get necrotic. This means that his skin and muscle began to



Engagement, spoke positively about how much this program has grown. "Our MAC program is super active and busy! We have one event scheduled on almost every Saturday until June, and several on weekdays. On any of these days, you can find us at festivals, parades, shops, parks.. anywhere that will have us!"

The goal of our PAL Program (Pets are Love) is geared toward folks who simply need a mental break. Roepke noted, "it is great for places like nursing homes, hospices, schools, and

break down. Fortunately, we were able to treat with a combination of medicines, laser therapy, physical therapy, chiropractic care, and acupuncture. After weeks of successful treatment, he was strong enough to leave our care!

Once his wounds began to heal, he was placed with a foster family who, after significant time and patience, helped him walk again! students who could use some love from dogs and cats."

Lastly, our No More Bullying Program is all about teaching empathy. Roepke remarked, "this program is designed to instill the core values of compassion, respect, responsibility, self-control, and integrity to students from grades 3-5." We are excited to see this program, as well as all our community engagement efforts, grow in the coming months!
