Roy

Roy came to Tulsa SPCA as a stray in May 2023. We determined he suffered from impaired vision and was hard of hearing. After looking him over, our Clinic Staff determined Roy was around 13 years old, which made finding the right home challenging. Quickly after arriving, Roy found his way into the arms of a foster family, who gave him love and care. Through no fault of either party, they returned Roy to Tulsa SPCA after one month. Then, Clinic Staff



noticed he was barely eating and scared of his surroundings. Upon hearing his story, and with a little encouragement from colleagues, Kyle Paddock, Director of Communications at Tulsa SPCA, became enamored with Roy. His family fell in love and two months later adopted Roy into their family. He even helps look after their children!

Cathy

Cathy came to Tulsa SPCA from another animal welfare agency after being found abandoned outside an apartment complex. She immediately greeted everyone who came near and radiated kindness. After arriving at our campus, we determined Cathy was FIV+, meaning she could not be around other cats. Erin Johnson, Tulsa SPCA Clinic Manager, noted Cathy was well cared for and already spayed, both uncommon

A Month to Remember

For those familiar with the animal welfare world, they know August means Clear the Shelters month! Clear the Shelters is a national initiative to raise awareness and promote adoptions. Here at Tulsa SPCA, we reduced the adoption fees for available dogs and cats to a NYD (name your donation) fee, which is a \$5 minimum. The reason, as the name would imply, is to encourage folks to adopt and clear our shelter! As of August 1, our shelter was very full with 76 dogs and cats. With a \$10,000 monthly fundraising goal, we knew we had our work cut out for us!

One of the main ways we inform the community of adoptable dogs and cats is through our social media pages. Each week our team determines which dogs and cats were available at a NYD price that week, and their pictures and descriptions were posted to social media. We also included convenient ways to donate so people could help us reach our fundraising goal. "Our aim was to help as many people as possible fall in love with our dogs and cats, then come by the shelter to meet them. I would post a dog and a cat each day, as well as a weekly photo collage -- the response from the community was always encouraging!" noted Kyle Paddock, Director of Communications at Tulsa SPCA.

In addition to reduced adoption fees, there were a number of other incentives to adopt





in August. Every Tuesday and Thursday of the month, adopters would receive a free item such as crates, gates, playpens, litter boxes, and more! A goodie bag of helpful information, coupons, and treats was also included. Renee Russell, VP of Operations, remarked, "These items are helpful as they allow adopters to start with an item like a crate that can help their pet settle into their new home."

All of these fantastic efforts led up to our Clear the Shelters event at our campus on August 26. All available dogs and cats were at a NYD price, eager and with anticipation to meet their forever families. We had a food truck, snow cones, raffles, t-shirt sales, vendor tables, and more! All staff and many volunteers (seen above) were ready to help process the upcoming tidal wave of adoptions and distribute information about Tulsa SPCA and overall care of adopted dogs and cats.

As one can imagine, this event took a massive amount of coordination and planning. Adopters were given the opportunity to fill out an application and provide veterinary records in advance and be pre-approved, or they could apply onsite. We took dogs out one by one for showings, while cats were available for viewing and cuddles in our Mobile Adoption Center (seen to the left) and in our cat colony rooms in the shelter.

"It was incredible to see everyone who came to adopt eager to meet the dogs and cats. Each dog and cat got attention--people were willing to spend time with so many of our animals, not just honing in on the one they wanted to adopt," said Melissa Allen, Pet Care Specialist.

Speaking of adoptions--August 26 was certainly a day to remember! In total, 35 dogs and cats were adopted into their forever homes. Chase (seen to the right) is eager to go home and be loved by his new siblings! In fact, even regular Tulsa SPCA volunteers got in on the action. Mara (seen above) was adopted by Eileen McFadden, one of our regular volunteers at our low-cost vaccine clinic. Another notable adopter was Paris Simone Sherra Epps, the winner of Tiny Princess of America Pageant! She is a Tulsa native and at just 7 years old, is the first African-American Tiny Princess of America. Her platform is adopting rescue animals, and

her family had previously adopted many animals from us. It's true what they say--age is just a number!

We think it's safe to say Clear the Shelters Day at Tulsa SPCA--and the whole month of August--were a resounding success. In August, 156 dogs and cats were adopted into their forever homes.

Finally, thank you. Thank you for sharing our posts on social media, engaging with our emails, attending our events, volunteering with us, and of course, adopting, not shopping. While August is notable for Clear the Shelters, clearing our shelter remains our goal all year long. Thanks to you, we can live out our mission to improve the lives of dogs and cats, and their human companions.


